

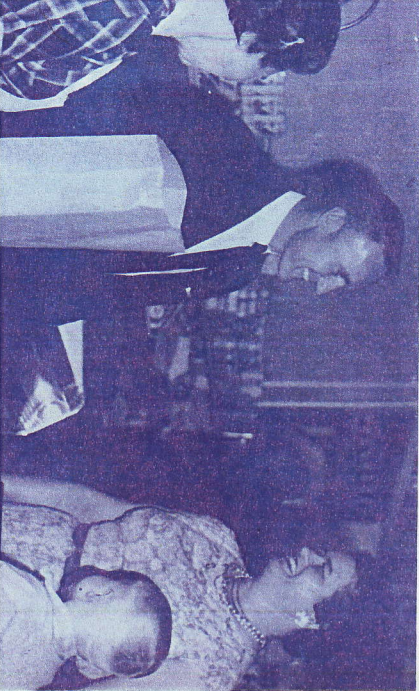
Kenny Sailor's Principles and Beliefs

▶ **INDIVIDUALISM.** An essential ingredient of freedom is responsible citizenship and individual responsibility. We must create and maintain an atmosphere where a man be allowed to do for himself what he is competent to do. We must reinforce, not replace, the individual's sense of responsibility.

▶ **CENTRALIZATION.** Political power has in all experience tended to grow at the expense of individual liberty. Centralization of more and more power in the hands of the Executive branch of government deprives us of our individual rights and freedoms, and stifles initiative. I reject the centralist's theory that those who govern know more than those who are governed—that power in the hands of the elite few will guarantee the rights of many. Government can give nothing in a material way that it has not first taken from the people. The purpose of government is to preserve order, not to order society.

▶ **EDUCATION.** Education is the protector of liberty. It must be free from Federal controls. The quality and scope of education must be under constant review and be a responsibility of local and state governments.

▶ **LIVESTOCK INDUSTRY.** Action must be taken to protect our livestock industry. Livestock imports have to be checked.



▶ **FOREIGN POLICY.** We must reverse the present trend of indecision and inaction in our relations with other nations. We must establish a firm and positive foreign policy aimed at taking the initiative and begin backing up our high-sounding words with equally noble deeds to advance the cause of individual freedom among the liberty-loving peoples of the world. We should negotiate from a position of strength, not of weakness. We must not allow another Cuba. We must re-instate the Monroe Doctrine. THERE IS NO SUBSTITUTE FOR VICTORY.

▶ **NATURAL RESOURCES.** We must vigorously pursue the protection of the present depletion allowance, multiple use of the public domain, coal and other natural resources, and water supply position for Wyoming's use and users.

▶ **CIVIL RIGHTS.** The controversial Civil Rights Bill will concentrate within the Executive branch of the Federal government powerful new controls over the private lives and property of all citizens. The wording in it is so ambiguous that the party in power could use it as an economic club against their political opponents. Federal bureaucracy will have unending authority to intervene in private enterprise as well as in state and local governments. The right to choose is the essence of freedom.
