

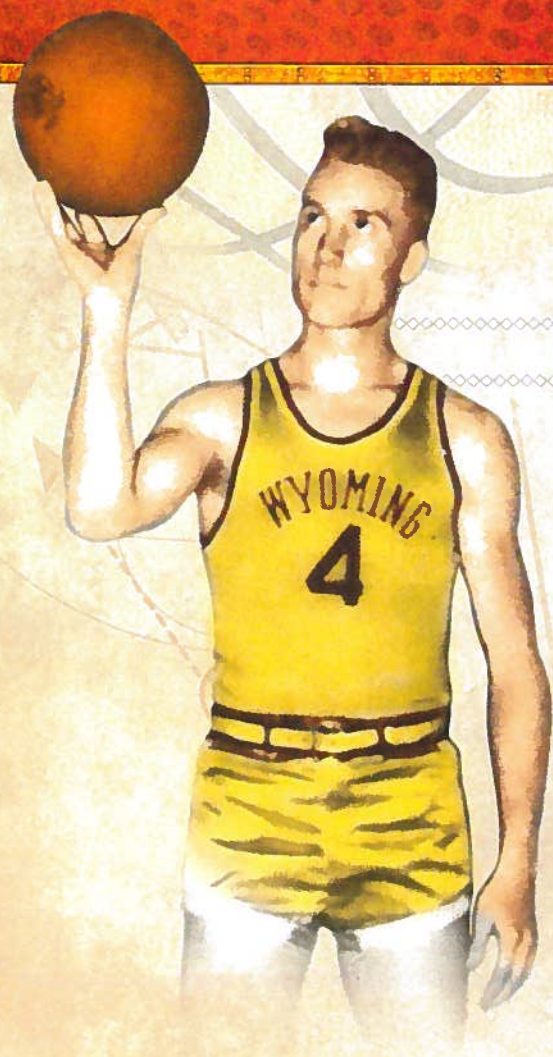

KENNY SAILORS

UNIVERSITY OF WYOMING

The man credited with revolutionizing the modern day jump shot, Wyoming's Kenny Sailors defined unstoppable. Described by various sportswriters as a "razzle dazzle dribbler" and "one of the speediest and classiest dribblers in the business," Sailors put on a show when his Cowboys took the court.

At 5-10, Sailors was certainly not the most formidable-looking player. But his skill with a basketball and his new-fangled way of shooting the ball, captivated fans and opponents alike. After coming off the bench as a sophomore, Sailors led the Cowboys to the 1943 NCAA championship – a 46-34 win over Georgetown in Madison Square Garden – his junior season and earned most valuable player honors in the NCAA tournament.

He averaged 15 points per game for Wyoming, which won 31 of its 33 games. Following his standout 1943 season, Sailors enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps to serve in World War II. He returned to Wyoming for his final season in 1945-46, once again earning all-conference and All-America honors.

Sailors helped Wyoming to an 82-11 overall record in his career and went on to play for five seasons in the NBA for the Cleveland Rebels, Providence Steamrollers, the Boston Celtics, the original Denver Nuggets and the Baltimore Bullets. He was inducted into the Wyoming Intercollegiate Athletics Hall of Fame in its inaugural class of 1993.

Joe Lapchick, whose blood pressure was sent to unnatural heights by Sailors' brilliance, agreed, 'He's one of the best ever to show in the Garden,' he said."
